



Conflict Free Minerals Declaration

January, 2018

To whom it may concern,

In July 2010, the U.S. Government signed the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the "Dodd-Frank Act"). The Conflict Minerals provision of Dodd-Frank Act 1502 places new burden on SEC registered corporations to trace and report the source of Conflict Minerals (tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold) in their products.

As an electronics manufacturer and importer, CnC Tech uses certain metals in products we produce.


While CnC Tech requires all our suppliers to comply with our Supplier Code of Conduct, we recognize the complex supply chain involved with certain metals and have taken steps to ensure that virgin metals we purchase do not originate in conflict mines. CnC Tech and its suppliers do not knowingly use any virgin tin or gold obtained from conflict mines and will regularly query suppliers to verify our requirements are being met to help ensure the health and safety of all workers in our supply chain.

Conflict Minerals means minerals that are sourced from DRC (Democratic Republic of Congo) and its adjoining countries e.g. Burundi, Rwanda & Uganda etc. The mining of those conflict minerals finance or benefit directly or indirectly armed groups in the DRC and adjoining countries.

We hereby confirm that those conflict minerals from the stated countries are not used in our products and components manufactured for and distributed by CnC Tech.

All members of our supply chain have to provide conflict free minerals material declarations to our partner manufacturers, which will also apply to new supply chain members by providing signed declaration.
